## SENATE BILL NO. 2162 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO CREATE SECTION 61-3-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CREATE THE JACKSON METROPOLITAN AREA AIRPORT AUTHORITY; TO ESTABLISH ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; TO PROVIDE THAT THE JACKSON METROPOLITAN AREA AIRPORT AUTHORITY SHALL EXERCISE ALL POWERS AND 5 DUTIES DELEGATED TO MUNICIPAL AIRPORT AUTHORITIES BY LAW; TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE JACKSON 6 7 METROPOLITAN AREA AIRPORT AUTHORITY; TO ABOLISH THE JACKSON MUNICIPAL AIRPORT AUTHORITY AND TRANSFER ALL POWERS, DUTIES, 8 9 FACILITIES AND RESOURCES TO THE JACKSON METROPOLITAN AREA AIRPORT AUTHORITY UPON APPROVAL OF THE JACKSON METROPOLITAN AIRPORT 10 11 AUTHORITY BY THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION AS AN ELIGIBLE 12 AIRPORT SPONSOR AND ISSUANCE OF AN AIRPORT OPERATING CERTIFICATE; 13 TO AMEND SECTIONS 61-3-3 AND 61-3-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** This section shall be codified as Section 61-3-6, 16 17 Mississippi Code of 1972: 18 61-3-6. (1) The Jackson Metropolitan Area Airport Authority 19 is created and established and full power is vested in the authority to manage, control and enforce all necessary and 20 beneficial matters pertaining to the operation of Jackson-Medgar 21 22 Wiley Evers International Airport and Hawkins Field Airport. The authority shall have the same powers and duties as a municipal 23 24 airport authority under this chapter and any other laws pertaining S. B. No. 2162 ~ OFFICIAL ~ G1/216/SS26/R45SG

- 25 to municipal airport authorities except in respect to the sale or
- 26 disposal of real property prohibited under subsection (5)(a) or
- 27 this section.
- 28 (2) The Jackson Metropolitan Area Airport Authority shall
- 29 consist of the following nine (9) commissioners:
- 30 (a) The Adjutant General of the Mississippi National
- 31 Guard, or his designee;
- 32 (b) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 33 Development Authority, or his designee;
- 34 (c) One (1) commissioner appointed by the Mayor of the
- 35 City of Jackson appointed for an initial term of one (1) year;
- 36 (d) One (1) commissioner appointed by the City Council
- 37 of the City of Jackson appointed for an initial term of two (2)
- 38 years;
- 39 (e) One (1) commissioner appointed by the Board of
- 40 Supervisors of Madison County appointed for an initial term of
- 41 three (3) years;
- 42 (f) One (1) commissioner appointed by the Board of
- 43 Supervisors of Rankin County appointed for an initial term of four
- 44 (4) years;
- 45 (g) Two (2) commissioners appointed by the Governor
- 46 from the City of Jackson appointed for terms of (5) years one of
- 47 whom shall be the holder of a valid pilot's license or
- 48 certification issued by the Federal Aviation Administration; and

- (h) One (1) commissioner appointed by the Lieutenant
- 50 Governor from the City of Jackson appointed for a term of five (5)
- 51 years.
- 52 (3) Unless otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this
- 53 section, commissioners appointed under paragraphs (c) through (h)
- 54 of subsection (2) of this section shall be persons with at least
- 55 ten (10) years' experience as a certified public accountant or
- 56 charter financial analyst, business owners with at least ten (10)
- 57 years' experience in executive management, persons with at least
- 58 ten (10) years' experience in the aviation industry, persons with
- 59 at least ten (10) years' experience in economic development,
- 60 attorneys with at least ten (10) years' experience in commercial
- 61 law, construction law or aviation law, persons who have been
- 62 holders of a pilot's license or certification issued by the
- 63 Federal Aviation Administration for at least ten (10) years,
- 64 persons with at least ten (10) years' experience in dealing with
- 65 public financing transactions, or persons holding certificates of
- 66 registration as a professional engineer with at least ten (10)
- 67 years' experience in the practice of engineering.
- 68 (4) After the initial terms, commissioners shall be
- 69 appointed in the same manner as the original appointment for terms
- 70 of five (5) years or until their successor is appointed and
- 71 qualified. Vacancies occurring other than the expiration of a
- 72 term shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as
- 73 the original appointment.

- 74 (5) (a) Upon review and approval by the Federal Aviation
- 75 Administration (FAA) of the Jackson Metropolitan Area Airport
- 76 Authority as an eligible airport sponsor and the FAA's review and
- 77 approval of the issuance of an airport operating certificate under
- 78 14 CFR part 139 with respect to the Jackson-Medgar Wiley Evers
- 79 International Airport, the Jackson Municipal Airport Authority is
- 80 abolished, and all powers and duties, airport equipment,
- 81 buildings, facilities, inventories, records, personnel, resources
- 82 and all other property, real or personal, tangible or intangible,
- 83 including any pertaining to or generated from revenues of the
- 84 airport, are transferred to the Jackson Metropolitan Area Airport
- 85 Authority. The Jackson Metropolitan Area Airport Authority may
- 86 not, by sale or otherwise, dispose of any real property acquired
- 87 by transfer in accordance with this paragraph (a) or subsequently
- 88 acquired by the authority.
- 89 (b) Upon the transfer required by paragraph (a) of this
- 90 subsection, the Jackson Metropolitan Area Airport Authority shall
- 91 assume all obligations of the Jackson Municipal Airport Authority
- 92 pertaining to the airport that are in effect at the time of the
- 93 transfer.
- 94 **SECTION 2.** Section 61-3-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 95 amended as follows:
- 96 61-3-3. The following words or terms, whenever used or
- 97 referred to in this chapter, shall have the following respective

- 98 meanings unless different meanings clearly appear from the 99 context:
- used, or intended for use, for the landing and taking off of
  aircraft, and any appurtenant areas which are used, or intended
  for use, for airport buildings or other airport facilities or
  rights-of-way, or for other appropriate purposes, including buffer
  areas and areas for airport compatible development, together with
  all buildings and facilities located thereon.
- 107 (b) "Airport authority" or "authority" means any \* \* \*
  108 airport authority created pursuant to the provisions of this
  109 chapter.
- 110 (c) "Airport hazard" means any structure, object or
  111 natural growth, or use of land which obstructs the airspace
  112 required for the flight of aircraft in landing or taking off at an
  113 airport, or is otherwise hazardous to such landing or taking off
  114 of aircraft.
- 115 (d) "Air navigation facility" means any facility other
  116 than one owned and operated by the United States, used in,
  117 available for use in, or designed for use in aid of air
  118 navigation, including any structures, mechanisms, lights, beacons,
  119 markers, communicating systems, or other instrumentalities, or
  120 devices used or useful as an aid, or constituting an advantage or
  121 convenience, to the safe taking off, navigation and landing of

- 122 aircraft, or the safe and efficient operation or maintenance of an
- 123 airport, and any combination of any or all of such facilities.
- 124 (e) "Bonds" means any bonds, notes, interim
- 125 certificates, debentures or similar obligations issued by an
- 126 authority pursuant to this chapter.
- 127 \* \* \*
- 128 (\* \* \*f) "Governing body" means the official or
- 129 officials authorized by law to exercise ordinance or other
- 130 lawmaking powers of a municipality.
- ( \* \* \*g) "Local government" means any local
- 132 governmental unit as defined in Section 17-13-5.
- 133 (\*\*\*h) "Municipal airport authority" or "municipal
- 134 authority" means a municipal airport authority created pursuant to
- the provisions of Section 61-3-5 or 61-3-6.
- 136 (\* \* \*i) "Municipality" means any county, supervisors
- 137 district or supervisors districts, or all that portion of the
- 138 county lying outside the territorial boundaries of any named city,
- 139 town or village, and a city, town and village of this state or any
- 140 state-supported institution of higher learning or any public
- 141 community or junior college.
- 142 (\*\*\*j) "Person" means any individual, firm,
- 143 partnership, corporation, company, association, joint-stock
- 144 association or body politic, and includes any trustee, receiver,
- 145 assignee or other similar representative thereof.

147	authority" means a regional airport authority created pursuant to
148	the provisions of Section 61-3-7.
149	SECTION 3. Section 61-3-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
150	amended as follows:
151	61-3-5. Any municipality or a state-supported institution of
152	higher learning or a public community or junior college, by
153	resolution, may create a public body, corporate and politic, to be
154	known as a municipal airport authority, which shall be authorized
155	to exercise its functions upon the appointment and qualification
156	of the first commissioners thereof. Upon the adoption of a
157	resolution creating a municipal airport authority, the governing
158	body of the municipality or of the state-supported institution of
159	higher learning or other public community or junior college,
160	pursuant to the resolution, shall appoint five (5) persons as
161	commissioners of the authority. The commissioners who are first
162	appointed shall be designated to serve for terms of one (1), two
163	(2), three (3), four (4) and five (5) years, respectively.
164	Thereafter, each commissioner shall be appointed for a term of
165	five (5) years, except that vacancies occurring otherwise than by
166	the expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term in
167	the same manner as the original appointments. This section shall
168	not apply to the airport authority created in Section 61-3-6.
169	SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2016.

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
